

NEW HAMPSHIRE REPUBLICAN STATE COMMITTEE QUALIFICATIONS TO BE A DELEGATE FOR THE CONVENTION

WHO CAN ATTEND AND VOTE AT THE CONVENTION?

No person except Delegates who have been credentialed and those NHRSC staff and officers designated by the Chairman shall be admitted to the Convention Hall.

Only credentialed Delegates may vote at, speak at, or participate in, the Convention.

WHAT ARE THE QUALIFICATIONS TO BE A DELEGATE?

Qualifications for Delegates to the Convention are defined in New Hampshire Statute:

TITLE LXIII, ELECTIONS, CHAPTER 667:

CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTIONS AND STATE PARTY CONVENTIONS

State Party Conventions, Section 667:21: Date, Call and Purposes

Delegates are those who won the Primary on 9/13/22 and became the nominees for the offices of:

Governor,

United States senator,

United States representative,

Executive Councilors,

State Senators,

County Officers,

State Representatives,

Winners of the Primary for the office “Delegate to the Convention”

State Party Conventions, Section 667:3 Roll.

Upon application of the chairman of the state committee of any political party, the secretary of state shall deliver to him a duly certified roll of the nominees of his party for the several offices named in RSA 667:21.

None but such nominees and state delegates shall take part in such state convention.

SOME MORE DETAILS:

A person can only become a Delegate by winning the 9/13/22 Primary for offices listed above.

Losing the General election doesn't change their status as a Delegate.

NH Republican State Committee Members are not automatically Delegates.

Moving from the town where elected or changing Party disqualifies a person as a Delegate.

Delegates have to be physically present for the Convention. No alternates or substitutions.
